1. Please describe the project.

The Annual Dubois Kids Fishing Day is a free event held at Pete's Pond on the first Saturday in June, coinciding with Wyoming's Free Fishing Day and National Boating and Fishing Week. Youth are provided fishing poles, tackle, and worms, and can participate without a license.

The event is organized by the Wyoming Department of Game and Fish, U.S. Forest Service, Dubois Anglers and Wildlife Group, and the Kiwanis Club. Experienced anglers are on site to instruct youth in fishing techniques, cleaning fish, and understanding local natural resources. A free lunch is offered to all attendees, making the day a community gathering in the outdoors.

Grant funding will support the purchase of materials including fishing-related prizes for youth participants, additional fishing poles, worms, and a pop-up tent for registration. These resources ensure the event remains accessible, well-organized, and focused on outdoor recreation and education.

This project is scalable in cost.

2. Which portion of the project will Never Sweat Recreation Board funds be applied to?

Funds from the Never Sweat Recreation Board will be used to provide supplies and prizes for youths at the event. Funds would be used to purchase fishing rods and tackle, fishing related prizes, worms, and a pop up tent for the registration booth.

3. What ages will be served through this project / activity?

Youth between ages 2 to 18 are able to sign up for the free event. Parents also attend the event to assist their children with fishing and have the provided lunch.

4. How many will be served by this project / activity?

About 65 youths would be served at the Kids Fishing day, and their parents that attend with them, bringing the total event attendance to about 80-90 people.

5. How much money has the Never Sweat Recreation Board awarded to this entity in the past year?

No funding has been awarded for this event in the past year.

6. During what period of time will this project / activity serve the community (i.e. year-round, summer, winter)?

This project would serve the community in the month of June. Kids Fishing Day is a one day event held on the first Saturday of the month. This year, it will be June 6th, 2026.

7. When will this project / activity be completed or available for participation?
Participation would occur on June 6th, 2026. The one day event would be completed that day.

8. What public input or planning has gone into this proposal?
This event is planned in coordination with the US Forest Service, Wyoming Department of Game and Fish, the Kiwanis Club, and the Dubois Anglers and Wildlife Group. This event has been occurring for decades and is a well known community event.

9. Is there a maintenance plan for this project? If so, please include.
Not applicable.

10. How does this project serve a particular need of the community?
Kids Fishing Day offers youth and families a free, structured opportunity to enjoy outdoor recreation and learn about natural resources. With equipment and instruction provided, children gain skills that encourage lifelong participation in outdoor activities like fishing. Partnerships with the Wyoming Game and Fish Department and U.S. Forest Service add hands-on conservation education, including lake stocking and resource stewardship, fostering awareness of fisheries management. The event also builds community connections by bringing families, volunteers, and organizations together for shared activities and a free lunch. This collective experience supports youth development and reinforces community

11. Has this proposal been coordinated internally and with other organizations? If so, please include documentation (Memorandum of Understanding, resolution, letter, etc.).
The Wyoming Department of Game and Fish, US Forest Service, Kiwanis Club, and Dubois Anglers and Wildlife Group sponsor the event and coordinate its annual implementation. There is not a written agreement for this coordination.

12. How is this project recreational in nature?
This event is directly related to recreation. Kids Fishing Day is recreational in nature because it offers youth and families the chance to enjoy fishing and outdoor activities at no cost. The event emphasizes the fun of spending time outdoors together, building skills through fishing, and enjoying a shared day of recreation in the community.

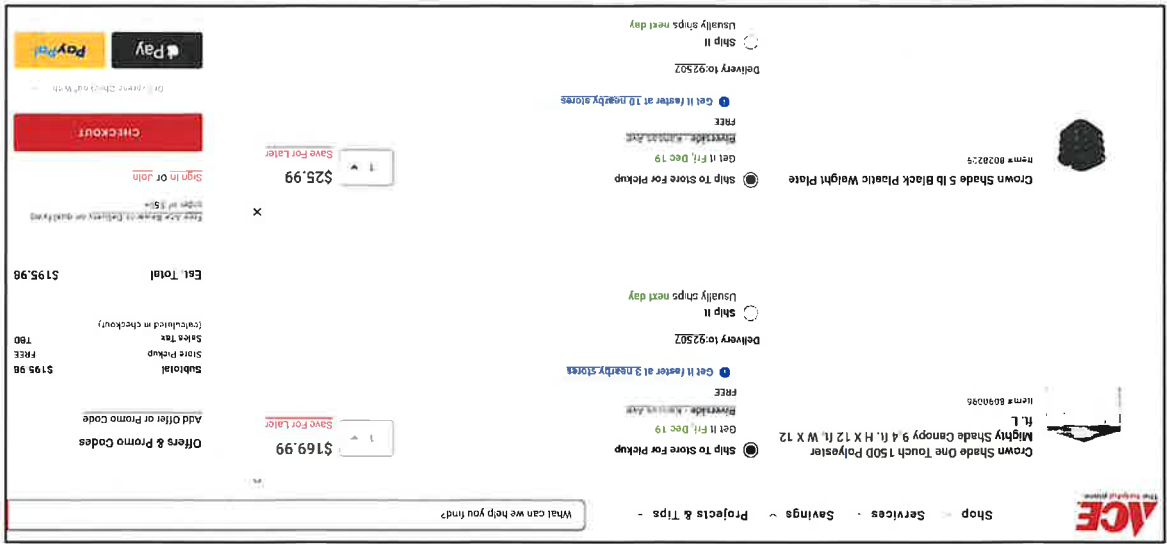
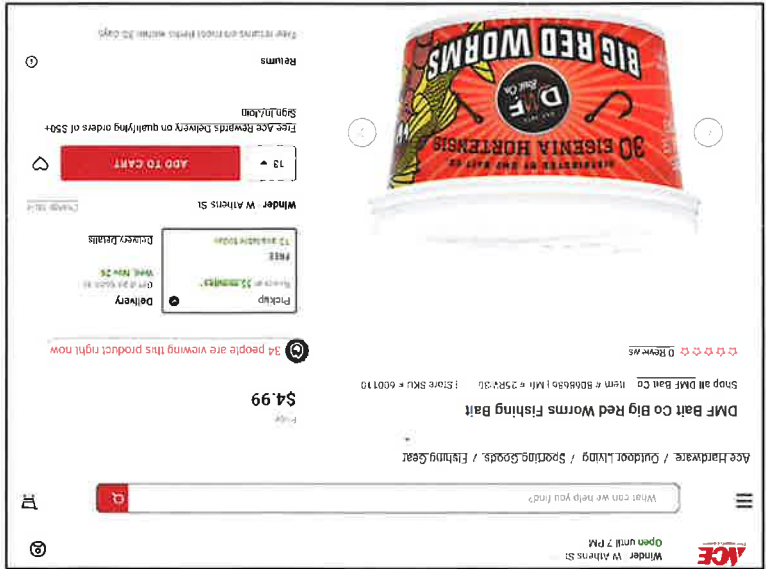

(WASHINGTON, April 23, 2025) – Independent Sector, with the **Do Good Institute**, announced today that the value of a volunteer hour is **\$34.79** — a **3.9% increase** from the previous year. Estimated from data collected in 2024, the figure illustrates the valuable and significant contributions volunteers make every day to support our communities and nation.

Charitable organizations most frequently use the value of volunteer time to recognize the amount of community support an organization receives from its volunteers. Corporations also use the figure to calculate the value of staff volunteer efforts in communities around the country.

“Volunteering is more than an act of kindness; it is a vital service that strengthens our communities and society as a whole. From responding to the diverse and urgent needs in our local areas to addressing the most daunting social challenges, volunteers are the unifying threads that bind us as a nation,” said **Independent Sector President and CEO Dr. Akilah Watkins**. “Nonprofits are at the heart of their work, providing the infrastructure and opportunities that make service possible — training volunteers, coordinating efforts, and creating accessible pathways for people to contribute their time and skills. To most effectively tackle our most pressing challenges, we must reinvest in volunteerism. And that includes acknowledging and celebrating volunteers not just during National

Volunteer Month, but every day of the year.”

“The estimated value of an hour of volunteer time, which reflects the value that volunteer labor adds to the capacity of nonprofit organizations, increased again in 2024,” said **Nathan Dietz, research director, Do Good Institute** and the researcher responsible for calculating the estimates. “The increase of 3.9% is greater than the overall annual inflation rate (2.9%), which shows that the contributions of volunteers are more valuable today than ever before.”

The state and national estimates of the value of volunteer time are based on the method used by Independent Sector in prior years. The primary assumption is that the value of volunteer service is based on the average earnings of private sector workers, excluding those who work on farms or in managerial occupations.

The latest value, calculated by the University of Maryland’s Do Good Institute, is measured based on annual average hourly earnings estimates that are available from the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). **[Learn more about the methodology.](#)**

The estimates may still understate the full value of volunteer service because they do not consider the many intangible benefits provided by volunteers that cannot be easily quantified.

In addition to the national number, Independent Sector also provides the state-level value of

volunteer time for all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. Values range from \$17.32 per hour for Puerto Rico to \$52.06 per hour for the District of Columbia.

WHEREAS, Town Code §10-4-3(c) may by resolution, suspend this subsection in those years that fire danger is high; and

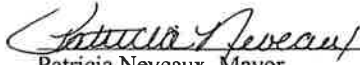

1. Please describe the project.

This project is for the purchase of a Titan Ace Pickleball machine, battery and charger, and pickleballs for use by our local Pickleball enthusiasts. This is a battery-powered, mobile training device to help players improve their skills. By using the controller or the Titan app, this machine employs preset or custom programs to deliver pickleballs to the recipient/trainee at various intervals, rate, speed, height, depth, and angles, all of which can be consistently replicated. By taking these kinds of repetitions, the user learns to anticipate, adapt, and adjust at their own pace, without the aid of a coach, thus optimizing time, effort, and costs.

Our own Dubois Pickleball enthusiasts are known collectively as the "Yee-Haw Pickleball Club". We meet regularly to enjoy the exercise and camaraderie. Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in the United States and has grown 311% over the past three years (www.sifa.com). Pickleball enthusiasts aspire to improve and advance in their hobby, there's not a professional coach in our area, and we're not likely to get one anytime soon. The Yee-Haw Pickleball Club would like to purchase a Titan Ace Pickleball machine, battery, charger, and pickleballs so members and newcomers can train and improve their skills.

2. Which portion of the project will Never Sweat Recreation Board funds be applied to?

Funding from the Never Sweat Recreation Board will be applied to the purchase of a Titan Ace Pickleball machine, battery, charger, and pickleballs.

3. What ages will be served through this project / activity?

Though the national average age of Pickleballers is 34.8 years old, there are no age limitations, only physical requirements or limitations. Our local members' ages range from five years old to late 70's.

4. How many will be served by this project / activity?

This project will immediately serve 30+ people in our community, and more will benefit as the sport continues to grow. Nationally, conservative estimates show growth of the sport through 2028 at 11.3%.

5. How much money has the Never Sweat Recreation Board awarded to this entity in the past year?

No monies have been awarded to Yee-Haw Pickleball Club this year.

6. During what period of time will this project / activity serve the community (i.e. year-round, summer, winter)?

The Titan Ace Pickleball machine will provide year-round use. It would most often be used at our town's outdoor Pickleball courts during the warmer (non-snowing) months, and indoors, at the school's gymnasium during the CWC Winter Sessions.

7. When will this project / activity be completed or available for participation?

Completion of this project will be determined by awarded funding date and availability of the Titan Ace Pickleball machine, as they are in high demand. Best estimates for receipt and completion are as early as three to eight weeks.

8. What public input or planning has gone into this proposal?

This project has not been presented publicly except for discussion with members of the Yee-Haw Pickleball Club. All research for the type, make, and model has been performed by Jason Gerona (club member).

9. Is there a maintenance plan for this project? If so, please include.

Maintenance on the Titan Ace Pickleball machine is minimal and would be performed by club members, as needed or required, in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.

10. How does this project serve a particular need of the community?

The Titan Ace Pickleball machine is an investment in our community's Pickleball enthusiasts and ultimately, our community. As the popularity of Pickleball continues to soar, so will the number of enthusiasts in our community. Almost daily, during the warmer months, vacationers visit our local outdoor Pickleball courts to play and interact with locals. When the day comes that the Dubois hosts Pickleball clinics, mini-camps, and tournaments, our local businesses will benefit.

11. Has this proposal been coordinated internally and with other organizations? If so, please include documentation (Memorandum of Understanding, resolution, letter, etc.).

As of the completion of this grant application, there has been no coordination with any other organizations or groups.

12. How is this project recreational in nature?

Pickleball is an affordable, healthy, recreational option for a broad demographic. With an expensive entry level, short learning curve, and mild physical demands, players are able to enjoy a fun way to get some exercise, meet new people and make new friends, while enjoying friendly competition. Few sports can match the full experience Pickleball creates. It is a \$1.5B market with an estimated 48.3M players. There are two types of people: Those who love Pickleball, and those who haven't tried it yet. Thanks for your funding consideration.

In its 7th year, Camp Bighorn is the National Bighorn Sheep Center's premier place-based and outdoor education program. Geared for ages 9-12, it is held at the Whiskey Mountain Conservation Camp, which allows campers to be immersed in and surrounded by bighorn sheep habitat and wintering range. The camp introduces and exposes children to topics such as stream ecology, taxidermy, ichthyology, wilderness ethics, medicinal and edible plants, and more. The information and activities are presented by professionals in the field.

The camper's enthusiasm and eagerness to learn, as well as the number of campers who are excited to return, are a testament to the camp's effectiveness and success and are extremely rewarding for the volunteers.

Camp registration, grants, and donations cover the basic costs of camp.
