1. Please describe the project.

We will sponsor 4 concerts this season:

Wednesday, June 24, 7 PM: Portable Masterpieces (9-member orchestra including strings, wind instruments, and keyboard). Our largest ensemble yet, performing works by generations of American composers in celebration of America's 250th anniversary.

Sunday, July 26, 3 PM: WyoJazz. By popular demand, bringing jazz back to Dubois again this year after its 2025 debut

Sunday, August 16, 3 PM: Central Wyoming Brass. A brass quintet, the first time this kind of ensemble has appeared among our offerings

Sunday, September 13, 3 PM: Jackson Hole Chamber Music. Ever-popular season finale featuring our partner organization, which brings top-rank musicians from across North America. The program is not yet set, but the ensemble will be a string quartet plus flute.

2. Which portion of the project will Never Sweat Recreation Board funds be applied to?

Travel costs (lodging for the June performers, gas and car rental for the September performers), venue rental fees and event insurance.

3. What ages will be served through this project / activity?

All ages.

4. How many will be served by this project / activity?

A reasonable estimate would be 200. It is difficult to anticipate how many people will choose to attend the first concert. Our typical audience for the following 2 concerts would be at least 40 people, and the final concert often attracts up to 60 listeners. However, experience suggests that if there are forest fires these may severely impact attendance.

5. How much money has the Never Sweat Recreation Board awarded to this entity in the past year?

6. During what period of time will this project / activity serve the community (i.e. year-round, summer, winter)?

The concerts are scheduled from June 24 through September 13.

* We have put December 30 as the end date when funds are needed because Jackson Hole Chamber Music (September 13 performers) are often late in billing us for travel costs.

7. When will this project / activity be completed or available for participation?

The first concert is scheduled for Wednesday, June 24, and the final concert is scheduled for Sunday, September 13.

8. What public input or planning has gone into this proposal?

During every season, we survey audiences about their reactions to the music. The responses to our final concert by Jackson Hole Chamber Music have always been overwhelmingly enthusiastic, and people often ask during the year when they will return. Last year, we featured our first jazz concert, with no idea how it would be received. The audience was equally enthusiastic, and many people pleaded for us to bring jazz back to Dubois, both in person and on surveys. Our second concert is a response to that appeal. Beyond that, audiences continually ask for more concerts. This year we offer four.

9. Is there a maintenance plan for this project? If so, please include.

Recently the Board completed a set of goals to assure that "our work will outlive us, and that our organization can continue regardless of who is at the helm and who may leave the Board of Directors." They specify activities that will allow us to devote our energies beyond ordinary project-planning to efforts that will allow us to grow toward sustainability.

10. How does this project serve a particular need of the community?

Dubois K-12 principal Malinda Garcia, in a letter to another grant agency, praised our activities as allowing audiences to "experience rich musical offerings while living in a district that is federally designated as 'beyond rural frontier'." Due to our town's small population and remoteness, our residents are disadvantaged by nature, especially with regards to the arts. We offer live music performances, in genres other than rock and Country & Western, that would not be available at all to people in Dubois who are unwilling or unable to pay high concert ticket prices for comparable events in Jackson or to travel 80 miles in any direction, probably entailing the cost of restaurant meals and an overnight stay.

11. Has this proposal been coordinated internally and with other organizations? If so, please include documentation (Memorandum of Understanding, resolution, letter, etc.).

When possible (not this season, due to the dates), we host performances at the local school in coordination with the curriculum. All of our activities are planned and carried out by consensus (or when necessary by formal vote) by the entire Board of Directors.

12. How is this project recreational in nature?

Merriam-Webster defines recreation as "refreshment of strength and spirits." Some of us believe music is in fact the finest kind of recreation. Especially in these troubling times, when our nation is at war, and political leaders and even members of our own community are divided and divisive in other areas of endeavor, our concerts allow us to sit quietly together in one common space, enjoying an activity that is at once personal and collective, and sharing an indescribable kind of pleasure unrelated to other activities and preferences. Our minds and souls can escape, dream, and experience renewal and emotional healing in a manner entirely incomparable to ordinary language or physical exercise.

Re: Estimates

We recognize that this is an unusually large grant request from you. Two extraordinary factors have led to this increased request for the coming season.

- We have not previously requested lodging costs from NSRB, but the two agencies that normally cover these costs (Wyoming Cultural Trust Fund and Wyoming Arts Council) will not pay for events that take place before July 1. The date for our first concert, June 24, depended on the other dates in that performing group's regional tour. They agreed to waive musician fees in lieu of lodging costs. Because of their chosen date, our request for lodging fees from the usual sources did not conform to the other agencies' procedures. We hope NSRB will be willing to assume this cost for this extraordinary concert that features our largest-ever performing group.
- The Dennison Lodge, which Jackson Hole Chamber Music prefers to the exclusion of the Headwaters for reasons of intimacy and acoustics, was not available to us on September 13 this year. (Their performance dates in Dubois are constrained by the other scheduled events in their own season in Jackson.) They agreed to perform in the Rustic Pine Tavern instead, if we took over the entire bar during the time of their performance. At \$600, the cost for that venue is substantially higher than for the Dennison. Owner Luke Sanders arrived at the fee by determining the likely loss of revenues, averaging his revenues during that time period over previous years. We felt we had no choice other than cancelling our most popular event, so we agreed. This may have the advantage of attracting new and different audience members to our most popular event.

The following points explain why we have not provided multiple quotes, as requested, for the items we are asking NSRB to cover or why in the case of car rentals the requested amount does not conform with the quotes.

1. Lodging: I have not provided more than one quote for this item because at the time I made the booking, we did not anticipate that we would be impelled to ask NSRB to reimburse us for this cost. Furthermore, we wanted to book all of the rooms in the same motel. Even many months before the event we found few motels that could accommodate all of the performers, and the Stagecoach was the least costly of these.
2. Car rentals: We have agreed with Jackson Hole Chamber Music that they will arrange the rental car and will invoice us after the concert. The quotes included here were provided on April 6, 2026. As you see, they range from \$125 to \$193. As we did last year, we are estimating a somewhat larger amount because it is difficult to judge car

rental prices in September when quoted in April without the intention of making the booking ourselves at the time. Obviously we will only request reimbursement for the actual cost of the rental.

3. Venues: We don't provide multiple estimates for venues because (as you know) there are few public venues available in Dubois. Also, these need to be booked far in advance. We discovered this to our chagrin when we learned in January that the Dennison Lodge had been booked a year earlier for our required date in September. We have chosen the venues that are most appropriate for the events in question.
4. Event insurance: We have learned from Tegeler Insurance and confirmed for ourselves that EventSured is the largest and perhaps only company that provides event insurance with the requirements demanded by other funding agencies and the Town government.

1. Please describe the project.

Renovation of the corner lot, 127 E. Ramshorn, Dubois, WY 82513. The primary goals are to improve safety and nighttime visibility, establish pollinator and drought-friendly plantings; provide durable seating and pedestrian-friendly surface; implement efficient irrigation and mulch for water conservation and weed suppression; create an attractive gateway that reflects community pride and create a welcoming corner that supports community gatherings, functions (square dancing, farmer's market, etc.) and year-round curb appeal. Scope of Work: Lighting: Install solar pathways/area lights. Plantings: Install annuals and perennials in all current planting beds. Tree trimming: Trim existing trees to maximize visibility. Planters: Install four whiskey barrels with soil and annuals; provide soil and annuals for current five wooden planters and one whiskey barrel. Seating: Install three commercial six-foot, thermoplastic coated benches. Irrigation: Install a new drip system to efficiently supply water to plantings and barrels. Mulch: Install 486 cubic feet of mulch to cover planting beds. Flagpole and flag: Install flagpole and flag with solar lighting. Archway entrance: Install large, log pole archway with sign at the corner entrance. Concrete surfacing: Replace gravel area with with 4,750 square feet of concrete.

2. Which portion of the project will Never Sweat Recreation Board funds be applied to?

Replacing the 4,750 square feet of gravel with concrete to create a durable, low-maintenance pedestrian surface.

3. What ages will be served through this project / activity?

A well-designed corner lot with an open concrete pad, landscaping, and gathering features is inherently multi-generational. It's greatest strength is that it doesn't serve just one group-it creates opportunities for people of all ages to use the space in different ways. Children benefit from having a safe, reliable surface for activities. For teenagers, this type of space can offer a place to gather socially in a visible, community-oriented setting. For adults, this space can host farmers markets, community events, and performances, creating opportunities for local vendors, organizers and residents to connect. Older adults and seniors benefit from accessible, well-maintained public space. Features like concrete pad, seating areas, shade from trees and good visibility make it easier and safer to attend events or simply spend time outdoors. Families as a whole benefit because the space allows multiple generations to be present at the same time. Events like square dancing, holiday celebrations, or festivals naturally bring together children, parents, and grandparents, reinforcing a shared sense of community.

4. How many will be served by this project / activity?

At the baseline, the project has the potential to serve the entire local population. Because the corner is prominent and centrally located, it's reasonable to view it as a community-wide asset rather than something limited to a small user group. This space will also serve visitors and tourists. They may attend events such as farmers market, festivals, or holiday celebrations, expanding the reach of the project beyond the local population. Over the course of a year, with multiple events and daily informal use, the total number of users can easily reach several thousand individual visits.

5. How much money has the Never Sweat Recreation Board awarded to this entity in the past year?

No money has been awarded to DVI for this project from Never Sweat Recreation Board.

6. During what period of time will this project / activity serve the community (i.e. year-round, summer, winter)?

Once constructed, the renovated corner with its concrete pad, landscaping, and seating--would typically serve the community continuously for decades depending on how well it is maintained and how the town continues to invest in upkeep. With proper maintenance, the space continues functioning as a central gathering point for multiple generations. It will be a permanent civic infrastructure. Its value grows over time as it becomes embedded in community traditions, annual events, and everyday social life.

7. When will this project / activity be completed or available for participation?

We are planning to have this project completed by the end of June 2026, depending on receiving the funding for the concrete. The rest of the project has been completed funded by Dubois Volunteers Inc., Jim Rice, Restoration Lumber, CK Horseback Adventures LLC, Sellnow Property Services LLC, and Kristi and Jerry Perry.

8. What public input or planning has gone into this proposal?

We have contacted the Town of Dubois, Mayor Pat Neveaux, Chamber of Commerce, Dubois Volunteers Inc., Kiwanis of Dubois, Luke Sanders (owner of the Rustic), Kyle Miller (owner of The Honey House), Rebecca Sellnow (Sellnow Property Services LLC).

9. Is there a maintenance plan for this project? If so, please include.

Dubois Volunteers Inc.(DVI) will provide routine care that includes watering, seasonal pruning, weeding, mulching, and replacing any dead or damaged plants. This consistent attention keeps the space visually appealing throughout the year and ensures that the landscaping continues to enhance the character of the site. DVI will also provide periodic maintenance for the trees as needed. DVI will be actively managing the drip irrigation system to ensure efficient and reliable watering. DVI will take responsibility for proper display and upkeep of the flag, flagpole and lighting of the flag. DVI will be maintaining the archway by keeping it in good condition and ensuring it remains safe and structurally sound.

10. How does this project serve a particular need of the community?

First, there's the economic ripple effect. A refreshed, attractive corner--especially if it includes updated landscaping, lighting, seating or accessibility--can draw more foot traffic. That benefits nearby businesses directly and can encourage new ones to open. When a key intersection looks lively and well cared for, it signals that the town is active and worth investing in. There's also a strong social benefit. Prominent corners often function as informal gathering places. Adding features like benches, greenery, art or a small plaza can turn a pass-through space into somewhere people linger. That creates more opportunities for casual interactions, which strengthens community ties and gives the town a stronger sense of identity.

11. Has this proposal been coordinated internally and with other organizations? If so, please include documentation (Memorandum of Understanding, resolution, letter, etc.).

Yes, This project was proposed to the Mayor, Town Council, Chamber of Commerce, Kiwanis, and the Dubois Volunteers Inc. Attached are the letters of support for the project.

12. How is this project recreational in nature?

One of the strongest recreational aspects is its ability to host organized and informal social activities. For example: Square dancing and community dances, giving residents a place to gather for traditional, intergenerational recreation. Live music performances, from local bands to small concerts, creating a cultural and entertainment hub. Farmers markets, where vendors can set up booths on a clean, level surface, encouraging local agriculture and social interaction. Fourth of July celebrations, including barbecues, small performances, community gatherings before and after fireworks. Christmas tree lightings, providing a central, accessible place for winter festivities and shared traditions. Fall festivals, such as pumpkin displays, craft fairs, or harvest-themed events. Beyond organized events, the space also supports everyday recreation. Residents could use it for casual meet-ups, kids' activities, pop-up games, or fitness classes. Its open design allows the community to adapt it as needs evolve, which is a hallmark of successful recreational infrastructure. Importantly, this kind of improvement also encourages community identify and participation. In our small town setting, even a simple feature like a well-designed corner lot can serve as the foundation for year-round recreation, bringing structure and opportunity to activities that might otherwise lack a dedicated space.
