1. Please describe the project.

Duffy's Community Fitness Center seeks funding assistance to replace a non-functioning elliptical machine with a commercial grade unit designed for continuous public use. Duffy's provides 24/7 access to community members as one of town's few indoor recreational facilities. The proposed elliptical will restore low-impact, full-body recreational activity access to young athletes, adults, seniors, and our seasonal residents.

2. Which portion of the project will Never Sweat Recreation Board funds be applied to?

Grant funds will be applied directly to the purchase cost of a new elliptical trainer, including freight and sales tax.

3. What ages will be served through this project / activity?

The project serves all ages within permitted facility guidelines (ages 12 and older). Community members of Duffy's range from 12 - 99 years old.

4. How many will be served by this project / activity?

Duffy's currently serves over 130 active monthly members who have 24/7 access to the elliptical trainer

5. How much money has the Never Sweat Recreation Board awarded to this entity in the past year?

No funds received by current management

6. During what period of time will this project / activity serve the community (i.e. year-round, summer, winter)?

The elliptical will provide year-round, on-going recreational benefit.

7. When will this project / activity be completed or available for participation?

The equipment will be purchased within 14 days of funding approval. Installed and available for community use within 30 days of approval.

8. What public input or planning has gone into this proposal?

On January 29, Duffy's distributed written communication to all active members requesting prioritization feedback regarding replacement of non-functioning cardio equipment. Seven written responses were received. The majority identified replacement of the elliptical machine as the highest priority for indoor recreation due to its low-impact design and full-body accessibility. Documentation of public input is attached.

9. Is there a maintenance plan for this project? If so, please include.

The facility follows a preventative maintenance schedule including routine cleaning, inspection, and upkeep. Minor servicing will be done in-house. The selected commercial models were chosen for durability and availability of replacement parts to ensure long-term sustainability. Operating revenue is allocated annually for equipment maintenance and repair.

10. How does this project serve a particular need of the community?

Dubois experiences extended winter conditions and limited indoor recreational infrastructure. During much of the year, safe outdoor recreation such as walking, jogging, hiking are restricted by weather and ice. Duffy's provides consistent indoor recreation options available to the community. The elliptical machine serves a critical need by offering low-impact, joint friendly cardiovascular recreation suitable for all ages and conditions from youth athletes, adults recovery from injury, seniors with limited mobility, and healthy bodies of all ages.

11. Has this proposal been coordinated internally and with other organizations? If so, please include documentation (Memorandum of Understanding, resolution, letter, etc.).

12. How is this project recreational in nature?

Recreation is defined as voluntary activity taken for health, enjoyment, amusement, and personal well-being. The proposed elliptical both constitutes and enables year-round recreation in Dubois. In our rural Wyoming community with extended wind and winter conditions, commercial fitness equipment serves as essential indoor recreational infrastructure.

I. Jill Judd called the meeting to order at 4:40 PM.

II. Approval of Agenda

Patrick Neary made a motion to approve the agenda for the 2/10/26 meeting and Jill Judd seconded the motion. Motion passed 3 to 0.

III. Approval of Meeting Minutes (11/11/25)

Patrick Neary made a motion to approve the minutes for the 11/11/25 Jill Judd seconded the motion. Motion passed 3 to 0.

IV. Visitor Comments -Open to Public Comments - No comments.

V. New /Old Business

A. Board Vacancies / Terms (Shawn Hess on Phone)

Jim Smith and Brad Lindsey are the only applicants for the open positions. Brad and Jim expressed interest to also retain positions on board if selected.

B. Action Item - Appoint At-Large Positions

*Patrick Neary made a motion to appoint **Jim Smith & Brad Lindsey** to fill the At Large Vacancy, with the term to end December 31, 2027. Jill Judd seconded the motion. Motion passed 3 to 0.*

C. Board Elections

Chairperson:

Patrick Neary nominated **Jim Smith** as Chairperson. **Jim** accepted the nomination.

Patrick Neary moved to appoint Jim Smith as Chairperson for the Never Sweat Recreation Board. Jill Judd seconded the motion. Motion Passed 4 to 0.

Vice Chairperson:

Jim Smith nominated **Jill Judd** as Vice Chairperson. **Jill** accepted the nomination.

Jim Smith moved to appoint Jill Judd as Vice Chairperson for the Never Sweat Recreation Board. Brad Lindsey seconded the motion. Motion passed 4 to 0.

Secretary/Treasurer:

Patrick Neary nominated **Brad Lindsey** as Secretary/Treasurer. **Brad Lindsey** accepted the nomination.

Patrick Neary moved to appoint Brad Lindsey as Secretary / Treasurer for the Never Sweat Recreation Board. Jill Judd seconded the motion. Motion passed 4 to 0.

VI. New Business

A. Grant Requests / Audiences with the Board

1. DAWGS / Dubois Kids Fishing Day 2026\$1,986.00

Representatives - Larry Lewis & Olivia Guthrie. Volunteer with DAWGS. Kids fishing day clinic. To help support the annual fishing day event put on the first Saturday of June. The event is a partnership with DAWGs, Wyo Game & Fish, Forest Service, Kiwanis, National big horn sheep center. The proposed funds are for prizes for the youth that participate in the youth. Ages 2-18 years old. 65 participants every year. Grant money is anticipated to be used for tackle boxes, fishing poles, worms, and a pop up tent for the registration booth. Do not currently have a pop up tent. The event emphasizes outdoor recreation and helps youth in the community to get hands-on experience with fishing. Larry Lewis - good event for several years. Appreciated the support from the past. PN - Quite a lot of material left over from previous years. Where does the access inventory go? Does the surplus material carry over year after year? LL-Either Game & Fish and the Forest Service take the rods back, and they are used to the next year. The current inventory is 45 rods, and G&F acquired some more too. LL - Every year the participation increases since the event is being held at Pete's Pond versus Scouts Pond. The agencies have an inventory every year, so that inventory is used year after year. PN - your intention is to then build the inventory up for carry over? LL - not necessarily to build up, but it depends on what Game & Fish and Forest Service brings. OG - changes each year what the different agencies can fund, and how much they can bring to the table. PN - Do you have a goal for the number that you would like? OG - goal is to have at least 80 poles at the event each year. The group finds that they have more attendees when the event is on the first Saturday versus 2nd Saturday. Any rods purchased would be used at the fishing day every single year.

2. Dubois Speedgoats MC/ 4th of July Fireworks 2026.....\$4,333.00

Representative - Mike Tornesello. Request is for the Fireworks this year. Last year at \$3,000, \$4,000 from Wyo Com Found, & \$4,000 from DVI. Dividing the monetary ask more evenly this year. Insurance also went up this year as well. For the 250th anniversary, bumped up a few more fireworks. No labor is paid. Effectively just asking for fireworks, insurance, and a dump fee. JJ - Lots of in-kind labor. PN - BL - only one supplier that is viable to provide the goods? MT - yes, only one supplier. That supplier also gives the launch tubes that we need. They waive the cost for the launch tubes. The only supplier that they heard from does not have reliability in stock. JJ - Have used the same supplier for many years (25-30 years?).

3. Yee-Haw Pickleball Club / Titan Ace Pickleball Machine....\$2,000.00

Representative - Jason Gerona. Community member for Yee-Haw Pickleball Club. Seeking funding to get a machine to help players practice. Helps new players and young kids practice. Portable machine and programmable with an app on the phone. The machine also has a remote control. Users can pre-program different placement shots. Priceless to have a machine that can consistently deliver something like that. Benefit for the community - fastest growing sport nationally. Club membership is growing. JS - Who is going to be responsible for the machine? A core group would be responsible for it. Do not just want to leave it out. Keep in a shed by the baseball field. JS - How to contact someone to use it? Good question - there is a facebook page. JJ - the school does PE units for Pickleball. The machine could be used by the school. Also a staff member runs the winter program. Could be a way to share the machine. JG - could also be a way to draw others from Lander and Jackson that have pickleball courts and pickleball players. PN - it is electric. It is DC power. Battery powered as well. Jill - also pickleball club has an EIN number now, and a bank account, and are in the process of applying to be a non-profit. JS - Main concern is accessibility. JG - do not want to give it to someone that they do not know. But it is accessible through someone in the pickleball group. The machine selected gets great high ratings. PN - Liability concerns? JG - it is a whiffle ball, someone being on the pickleball courts covered by the Town. BL - two bids on the same machine, difference in prices is for the machine. Always look for a 50% match by the organization. JG - some donations by members. BL - looking for other donations. Ask is in the 50% range.

4. National Bighorn Sheep Center / Camp Bighorn.....\$4,875.00

Representative - Beth Cable. Thank you for the past support of Camp Bighorn. 7th year of holding it. June 29-July 3. Day campers - 375, night campers - 750. Written for 5 scholarships for the day campers. Number of campers that cannot pay for the day campers. 10 day scholarships and 5 night scholarships. 50% match from the attendees. 30-35 kids. The nurse comes from Lander - want to provide a stipend for the position. Past camp director, Beth's first year directing. Past director has agreed to come help. Representatives from FS, Game & Fish work with us to help with the Camp at whiskey mountain. Schedule set. BL - How many Dubois, Crowheart, Wind River Reservation? Seven Dubois campers last year. Beth drove them in. Parents picked them up. Last year, no applicants from the reservation because they could not find a chaperone. The previous year they had five. PN - point out that the anticipated revenue asking for \$4,875 - putting together \$19K in cash. Tremendous leverage there.

5. Little Lambs Childcare Center / Little Lambs Spring Adventures...\$1,291.97

Representative - KimChi Vu - Board member for LLCC. Focusing on the outdoors for the children. The first part is to update the outdoor area for the children. Need a new sandbox. Two years ago we were funded for a sandbox, but it wasn't great quality, so it needs an upgrade. Also want a gardening set and a picnic table. Beyond the outdoors backyard area, the director has been looking for ways to transport children to other areas around town. Another way would be with a buggy and a stroller. There are two bids - preference for the more expensive stroller - higher quality matters. Want the stroller to last longer. Type of events we would like them to go to - Story time at the library, events at the Town Park, and the Toddler Time at the Headwaters. *JS - other sources for funding?* KCV - Looking at other sources, trying to exercise other sources, but since this is recreational in emphasis - in kind donations with volunteer time. JJ - Finding strollers, six kids in one unit - would like to see another bid for the larger one.

6. DSAR Foundation / Outdoor Recreation Education Fund.....\$30,000.00

Representative - Pixie Herbert. Board chair of the newly formed Dubois Search & Rescue Foundation. Right now Dubois does not have an outdoor education facility. Does not have anything local. Wycer Fund. Wisk platform. If we bring in instructors - \$12,000 - 15 members trained up, 3 spare can offer to the community - still is \$1,000 - do not have the funds up front to pay for the instructors. This \$30k will go into perpetuity, because of the Wisk platform that reimburses 100%. Community members will need to pay. Stop the Bleed, Hunter Safety, Search and Rescue could take JJ - *Would need to see what your relationship with the State Search & Rescue is. Need some sort of MOU or resolution, or something to guarantee the funds. Why don't they just pay for your classes? Why do they work for reimbursement?* They do not say that it is 100%, BUT, visiting with Teton Search and Rescue, they have never had anything denied. - This is a very secure fund. JJ - The funds that we give out have to be spent within a year. PH - Would make sure that the funds would be spent within the first year. JJ - we have funded search and rescue classes in the past. We would consider funding classes as they become available. I have a hard time just saying that "here is \$30k" - there are ways to consider funding to help with direct classes. It is also concerning that the public would still have to pay. PH - I was still at the school today doing avalanche training - the teachers wanted more opportunities to bring classes in town, they said that they would find funding to send high schoolers to the classes. IF we want to get technical, immediately offer two classes that cost \$15k each to offer. PN - The board has the authority - I'm in favor of funding a project, a class, hard to say "here is \$30K". PH - The goal for any funding, is for it to be worthwhile, and would go the distance. Have a strong desire to educate the team and to educate the town. Happy to amend the funding, but it is very rare for a set amount of money to keep giving and giving and giving. Every year we want to offer 3-4 classes a year. PN - assuming reimbursement. PH - do not have concerns about reimbursement. JJ - have concerns that the state funding may not always be there. Have concerns that "here is a set money to spend at your discretion." PN - in favor of search and rescue, and in favor of education, but we have restrictions on how we can award money. PH - trying to be the organization to fund the instruction. NOLS is on the higher end. PH - If we get funding, we will hold a wilderness first responder class by the end of March.

7. Dubois Softball League / Infield Refurbishment Softball Field.....\$19,866.00

Representative - Jill Judd. The project is to refurbish the infield of the soft ball field Dubois Town Park. Seventeen years since any infield work. 50% sand is gone. the arc of where the infield meets the grass there is a drop, It needs to be leveled. Need a special infield sand mix. We can't find the type of sand needed in Wyoming. Field needs 150 tons to add 2 inches on top of what is left there. Gentlemen in Pinedale helped Jill find resources. Company in Colorado would bring the equipment, fix the infield, the works. A company in Idaho is significantly higher in price. It is a challenge to find anyone to do the work in Wyoming. The cost of the project would include changing some of the irrigation system. Included is also installing new anchors for new bases - want to place anchors for Little League and for softball bases. Work includes installing a rubber screen behind the backdrop to retain the sand. Total cost is \$38k. The Town of Dubois cannot be the granting agency because they are applying for a grant to replace the bridge at the rodeo grounds. Dubois Softball League is an organization, DVI is the sponsoring agency. They also granted us \$5k toward the project. DVI is \$5K cash. The town granted \$2,500 cash and \$5k in kind labor. There is an in-kind donation from a plumber to do the irrigation work. The Softball League is donating the labor to install the screen and the bases. Also applying to the Opp Shop for grant money for the bases and the screen. Asking NSRB for the sand and the transportation of the sand. Much needed. Softball league is resurrected. 4 teams last year, 6 teams this year. Last year 48 kids for a summer baseball program. This year it will be an all summer long program. Also will be hosting a state tournament this summer on the field. *PN - Will the field be maintained?* The larger maintenance piece is the town responsibility. The town maintains the grass. The Dubois Softball League maintains the sand and paints the lines. The infield turf is really really expensive. Extend the life of the infield, then maybe look at the turf.

8. Duffy's Community Fitness Center / Year-Round Indoor Rec.....\$1,562.50

Representative - Becki Niedens. Currently running business out of Duffy's. Applying for an elliptical trainer. At the time applied, down a treadmill. \$500 from the business towards the elliptical. Looking for members to donate towards the elliptical. The equipment belongs to the Dubois Medical Board. *JJ - Paid membership to use the elliptical?* The Dubois Medical Board would ultimately own the elliptical. *BL - did you get actual bids? An actual write up - need the actual bids. went to amazon. One bid for two different pieces of equipment. One bid for each item. Need two bids for each item.* *BN - two different models to replace the one that is there.* *JJ - need print outs from the websites.* *PN - have a dollar amount, but not an official bid.* *JS - I am not a member of Duffy's. Could I use this at any time?* *BN - if you become a member.* *BL - quite a ways back, the board contributed significant money into the extension so that kids programs could be free access.* *BN - was not informed of that deal.* *BL - Would that be part of the deal now?* *JJ - There is a business there, and there is a non-profit owning the equipment.* *BL - When there came time to build a volleyball court, Duffy's would not allow access to non-members.* *BN - YMCA example - a non-profit that serves the community. Have to pay the membership to use the equipment.* *JJ - Boys and Girls Club kids pay a small fee to the non-profit.* *BL - still trying to figure that out.*

PN - public funds. *JJ - Limited funds every quarter. Funds come from a mill levy.* *JJ - Public is welcome to stay for the discussion.*

KC - Second bid now?

JG - Search and Rescue is the least funded group in Dubois, but most used group in this town. Get called out at 2 am in the group - a small group is qualified to do it. This community is so ill-informed about how Search and Rescue works in this town.

JS - definitely support it.

JJ - Have funded multiple things in the past for Search & Rescue.

Discussion: Stroller is the best part of the funding request. Would like to see two quotes for the one we would be able to fund. JJ - They need anything that they can get. BL - They don't have 50%. They should go to the Opp Shop for a grant. They might be going to the Opp Shop for something else. Could be why it's not included here. Sara knows where to go. Not much match from this organization. Not that big of an ask. Contingent on a second bid. Approved contingent on a second bid on the bigger stroller.

8. Duffy's Community Fitness Center / Year-Round Indoor Rec.....\$1,562.50

Discussion: JS & JJ - having trouble with the application. JS. - the only people that use it pay to use it. PN - I don't know why it is to Duffy's. Dubois Medical Clinic Board apply. Membership only makes it difficult. JJ - do not give money to benefit the business. JJ - Ask the Dubois Medical Center to apply? It will be owned by the medical board. JJ - Doesn't fit the criteria.

*Patrick Neary made a motion to **DENY** the Duffy's Community Fitness Center grant request in the amount of \$1562.50 for Year-Round Indoor Recreation because it does not fit criteria of public access to recreation. **Brad Lindsey** seconded the motion. Motion passed 4 to 0 vote.*
