1. Please describe the project.

This project is focused on updating and enhancing Little Lambs Childcare Center's (LLCC) education, movement, and other experiential learning opportunities for children in our care. We are requesting recreation funds to specifically enhance sensory experiences for children ages 0-5, with a focus on toys and activities that help children express themselves, use fine and gross motor skills, develop social interaction skills, and creativity, all while either moving or creating with their minds and bodies.

The "wish list" which outlines the requested items. We have also included music, indoor/outdoor play sets, craft and art supplies and a new i-pad which is to replace our older, donated i-pad. This i-pad is used in daily communications and reporting with parents, as well as in helping communicate important updates regarding assessments of children's growth and learning.

2. Which portion of the project will Never Sweat Recreation Board funds be applied to?

When we moved to the new location of our operations in early summer 2025, we rearranged what toys and play equipment were accessible to accommodate our new space. After being settled into our Welty Street space, we recognize the opportunities to expand daily learning activities for the children in our care and this includes the new items and activities outlined in this request. Other funding support assists us in our daily operations (WY Community Foundation grant support, for example, as well as donations from private donors). The Never Sweat Recreation Board funds apply specifically to these new items and supplies needed to carry forward our mission to serve children in our Dubois-Crowheart community.

3. What ages will be served through this project or activity?

LLCC is focused on serving children ages 0-5 years old.

4. How many will be served by this project/activity?

Up to 15 children at any particular time, but over time, these materials and supplies will serve up to hundreds of children who participate at LLCC.

5. How much money has the Never Sweat Recreation Board awarded to this entity in the past year?

\$0 this past year, \$910 in 2024.

6. During what period of time will this project/activity serve the community (i.e. year-round, summer, winter)?

Year Round use (indoor and outdoor play and educational materials).

7. When will this project/activity be completed or available for participation?

As soon as materials are ordered and installed, children and staff can begin utilizing the activities, so as early as January 2026.

8. What public input or planning has gone into this proposal?

Little Lambs Childcare Center's mission is to collaborate with families to provide a caring, nurturing, and safe environment for children in the Dubois-Crowheart community. We are the only daycare serving children and families every weekday, and we seek input from all families with children in our care as to what activities, learning experiences, and changes they want to see in our operations. With several younger children currently in our care (in the 1-3 age range), we are seeking to expand and hone in our activities to cater to the unique learning and skill development of this age group. The items and supplies requested through this grant will help us target new, fun, engaging and skill-developing activities for this particular age group of children in our care.

9. Is there a maintenance plan for this project? If so, please include.

Our staff, board, and volunteers will care for and maintain the items purchased with this grant, keeping them in clean and working order with the goal of long-term use.

10. How does this project serve a particular need of the community?

LLCC is open and available to any families with children ages 0-5 in the Dubois-Crowheart community. We do not discriminate based on economic, social, ethnic, gender, racial or other qualities. Our goal is to provide childcare for any family in need of child care, on part-time or full-time basis, and with subsidies available to those who require additional support. As mentioned above (#8), we are hoping to expand our educational activities with a focus on supporting the development of sensory, motor, social, and emotional well-being and skills of the children in our care. Many studies have shown that children's cognitive and academic development through experiencing quality early learning opportunities with individualized learning experiences helps children prepare for school through the building of social skills, emotional regulation and resilience, independence and confidence and physical development and health. These are all areas of focus for LLCC in our daily activities to meet these needs of our community.

11. Has this proposal been coordinated internally and with other organizations? If so, please include documentation (Memorandum of Understanding, resolution, letter, etc.)

LLCC has been coordinating all fundraising needs internally with our board and staff. We have prioritized general operating support wherever possible, knowing the challenge of consistency in maintaining enrollment, so whenever opportunities like the Neversweat Recreation Board Grant or other project-specific funding opportunities open up, we target these at the areas outside of our general operations needs. We actively fundraise from a wide variety of sources, including private donor outreach, matches or pledges, general operating support grants (public and private), and events (such as the summer golf tournament and raffles). We will continue to coordinate with staff, board and volunteers to spread the word about our daycare offerings with the goal of expanding enrollment and helping support more families.

12. How is this project recreational in nature?

With the goal of helping children in our care grow and learn, this grant and the materials and supplies being requested supports the well-being of these children. Indoor and outdoor creative, sensory-driven play is proven to provide extensive benefits for children, from physical development (gross and fine motor skills, balance, strength, healthy weight maintenance, and immune function), to emotional intelligence skills (helping children understand and express feelings), build communication and social skills, nurturing empathy, and building confidence. The toys, materials, and equipment requested in this grant will support all of these areas of development LLCC is focused on helping the children in our care develop. LLCC's goal is to create a caring, nurturing and safe environment for the enrolled children, and this grant will help enable important recreational play as part of this goal.

V. New Business

A. Grant Requests / Audiences with the Board

1. Mountain Grace Archery / Mountain Grace Archery Program\$972.00

Representative: James Johnson. Program supported in the past by NSRB. Mountain Grace Archery **would like to add some additional bows and purchase some replacement arrows.** The program continues to grow. Last year the NSRB added additional targets to the program. The program is able to accommodate 20-24 people at a time. More and more children are participating. Need equipment to accommodate the additional children. Participated in Camp Courage again at Crooked Creek. 35-40 children participated, and parents were able to participate this year. The program has three certified instructors. The program serves ages 5-80. JJ - Do participants pay to participate? The participants pay for the winter program. Food is also provided as part of the winter program. The Camp Courage program is free of charge. JJ - How long does an average bow last? Lasts about 10-12 years, and they get quite a bit of use. These are regular compound bows. BL - think it's a really good program - Asked about 2nd bid. The bows are less than \$250 each, so additional bids are not needed.

2. Little Lambs Child Care Center/ Little Lambs Education & Equipment...\$943.10

Representative: Sara Domek. **Application for Sensory Based play items and items for gross motor skills.** The organization has sorted through inherited toys, and has kept the usable ones. Staff would like to focus on the key age of 0-5 years old. Music instruments and movement indoor and outdoor are requested. Several toys are for social interaction as well. Upgrade the current toys, most are for indoor use. Serve anywhere from 5-9 kids, plus drop in kids. The goal is to be a sustainable childhood care option in the community. The organization is exploring other funding options as well - Wyoming Community Foundation was mentioned. The center is now located on Welty Street. JJ- How many people are employed? Two people are employed - a director and an assistant director. JJ - The math is a little wrong on the application. Adjustments to the application were made during the meeting, but the total request amount is not altered. JJ - Another concern is that the iPad is more operational versus recreational. All the equipment and toys other than the iPad seems to fit. iPad is used for when the State does the assessment with the kids, the iPad is used.
